feeling on the bench that told me we weren't out of it."

Cornell ended up with good balance in its scoring. Stornik had two goals, while Nethery, Olds and Gemmell all scored one goal and two assists. Hennessey had a goal and an assist, and Brian Marrett had two two assists.

For two periods, Tuesday's game looked like a replay of last year's 8-5 Providence win in the quarterfinals. Cornell peppered Milner with shot after shot, especially during the first 10 minutes of play, but the steady Friar netminder kept the Red at bay. "He was unconscious out there," Nethery said.

Cornell outshot Providence, 49-28, Tuesday, and held a 21-8 advantage in the third period. Five of those Providence shots came in the first four minutes, two others came within three minutes left in the game, and Wilson's missed chance at the open goal was the final shot. Providence did not manage a shot on goal during overtime.

A pair of penalties midway through the first period took away Cornell's momentum, and an opportunistic Providence team made the penalties hurt even more by scoring on both power plays. Steve O'Neill tallied for the Friars at 9:10, and Colin Ahern scored at 14:31.

A second period goal by Wilson made it 3-0, and Bauer's goal 46 seconds into the third period made it 4-0, leaving Cornell a steep hill to climb.

The Red broke through for the first time when Stornik took a pass from Brock Tredway and beat Milner to the goalie's right at 3:10, but Bauer

took the life out of the crowd 50 seconds later, as he scored on a rebound.

For the next 16 minutes, Cornell goalie Brian Hayward had very little activity. Like an sculptor chipping slowly at stone, Cornell's offense began to click, and a rally slowly took form.

Stornik scored his second goal at 7:39, tipping in a Nethery slap shot. Hennessey scored at 9:35, on a slap shot from the point. Olds tallied at 14:49, blasting it past goalie Milner from the left faceoff circle. And finally, Nethery scored the tying goal, bringing the crowd to its feet and leaving Milner visibly shaken.

The overtime was all Cornell. The Red lost the opening faceoff, quickly cleared the puck from its zone, and then, after taking a second to get organized, kept play in the Providence end. The winning goal came when Marrett shot wide, but Gemmell, who was breaking down the left side, tipped the puck up and over Milner.
