Cornell vs. Princeton

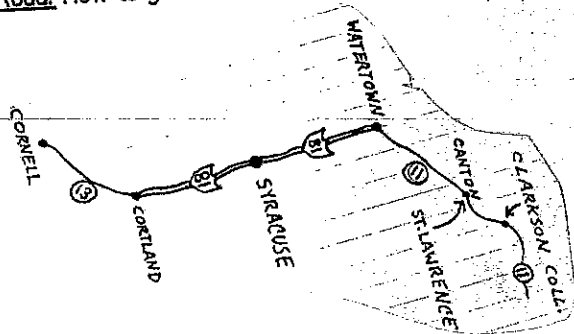
Lynah Notes:
